<ul> <li>MEDICAL EMERGENCY</li> <li>Do not attempt to move the injured person unless they are in immediate danger.</li> <li>Immediately call emergency personnel: 9-1-1.</li> <li>Provide as much information as possible.</li> <li>Follow all instructions of the operator.</li> <li>Provide care if you are trained to do so.</li> <li>Only give care to your level of training and comfort.</li> <li>Stay with the injured/ill person until emergency personnel arrive.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>ACTIVE SHOOTER</li> <li>If you cannot escape, locate a room to take shelter.</li> <li>Secure &amp; barricade the door(s). Close blinds or other window coverings.</li> <li>Turn off lights, radios, computer monitors, and silence cell phones.</li> <li>Remain quiet. Encourage others around you to do the same.</li> <li>Stay out of sight (i.e.: hide behind a concrete wall, desk, etc).</li> <li>DO NOT evacuate for a fire alarm UNLESS you see smoke or flames.</li> <li>Follow the EXACT orders of law enforcement.</li> <li>Remain in shelter until an "all-clear" message is received.</li> </ul>
